O Creator, I am pleading with you to help me. You see that I'm not okay. Strengthen me. Give me a straight path, because you have the power. Amen.

O Creator, it is evening. Your day was good. Watch over me while I sleep. Amen.

Unlike in other units, we present here five example prayers, instead of a list of conversations. These are intended to be used in the morning, at a language class, to give thanks for food, to ask for help, and in the evening, respectively.

Some learners do not pray. Non-praying learners should treat this unit as a chance to practise making requests, as well as complex sentences like those with *hupii*, the glue word *?ani*, *?in*, and the various moods that are used in embedded clauses.
